LITA is grateful again this year to Teen and Parents Service Society, Katey Alva, below, holding her fall stack of artful card work. **TAPS** Highschool students continued making sweet, personalized and very cheerful holiday cards and LITA distributes them at facilities in Martinez, Pittsburg, Concord, Pleasant Hill and El Sobrante. Extra card gifting was possible this year to 420 combined SNF residents at Windsor Manor Care in Pleasant Hill, Vale Care in San Pablo and the Shields Nursing Centers in El Cerrito and Richmond.

For the past 10 years Sarah Peterson and I have met in front of her Berkeley apartment, so I can pick up and deliver her soft colorful hand knit blankets. She's donated over 150 by now. First blanket recipient of 2023 was lovely Bayberry resident, Lynn Jaeger. On Dec 6th she cuddled up under hers, delighted, while we pruned and puttered at our garden session, the first one allowed since a long RSV quarantine. November was misery for Lynn. Her roommate Lily fell ill and never came back from the hospital. Facility nursing isolated Lynn. That Wednesday was the first time in over a month the residents were allowed to gather in the dining hall together and a visitor (me) was allowed in, well-masked of course. I took the picture (below) of the two good friends back in October. Staff and residents all miss Lily but Lynn most of all. Dec 24th is our final zoom caroling show with SNF residents. 

LITA has since turned to tablets as a sturdier, easier, and more affordable option than iPads. Tablets are still in use and much in demand. Facilities ask for new devices, for a number of good reasons, so we don't take used equipment unless professionally refurbished.
